PREAMBLE

The Postgraduate Entrance Test (PGET) shall comprise two papers, each carrying 100 marks, consisting of 100 Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs) and having a duration of two hours.

Paper I shall assess the Basic Medical Sciences taught during undergraduate medical and dental education. Separate Paper I examinations shall be conducted for MBBS graduates and BDS graduates, based on their respective undergraduate curricula.

Paper II shall be specialty-specific. Separate Paper II examinations shall be conducted for each of the notified medical and dental specialties according to the specialty selected by the candidate.

Curriculum of PGET Paper II includes contents of MBBS Medicine curriculum and its clinical application covered during house job.

The Tables of Specifications (TOS) for Paper I and Paper II have been developed through a consultative process involving subject experts from all public sector medical universities in Punjab, along with subject experts from the relevant Specialty Advisory Committees (SACs) of the University of Health Sciences, Lahore.

This booklet provides the topics and sub-topics to be covered in the examination, along with the distribution of questions against each topic/sub-topic. It is intended to provide a clear and uniform framework for the preparation of PGET examination papers.

Development of Tables of Specifications

Step	Process
1. Engagement of Universities	All public sector medical universities in Punjab were engaged in the development of the Tables of Specifications.
2. Involvement of Subject Experts	Subject experts from the respective disciplines of these universities participated in identifying and reviewing the relevant topics and sub-topics.
3. Specialty Advisory Committees	Subject experts from the relevant Specialty Advisory Committees (SACs), UHS Lahore, also participated in the development and review process.
4. Preparation of TOS	The topics and sub-topics for each paper were finalized and the number/distribution of questions against them was determined.
5. Finalization	The Tables of Specifications were finalized after review and consultation with the participating subject experts.
